

Crawford County Commission met pursuant to adjournment with these members present: Steve Black, Presiding Commissioner; Mark Pfeiffer, Commissioner District 1; Jared Boast, Commissioner District 2; and Jenni Pilkenton; and the following proceedings were had to viz;

Attendees at the beginning of the meeting included Jordan Trendle, Kellie Vestal, Amy England, Jax Jensen, Kim Gibbs, Gary Mace, Jessup Boast, Loren Wilson, Karen Sikes, and Darin Layman.

9:00 a.m.: Pastor Gary Mace opened the meeting with prayer.

9:01 a.m.: Mark Pfeiffer made a motion to accept the agenda for the June 30th, 2026, meeting of the Crawford County Commission. Jared Boast seconded the motion. All in favor; motion carried.

9:02 a.m.: Jared Boast made a motion to approve the Crawford County Commission meeting minutes for June 16th, 2026, meeting of the Crawford County Commission. Mark Pfeiffer seconded the motion. All in favor; motion carried.

9:03 a.m.: Mail and Documents:

Mark Pfeiffer received a letter from Mike Pendleton stating that he would no longer be able to brush hog the County landfill. The County will have to explore other options for the future.

9:03 a.m.: County Official Reports:

Karen Sikes gave an update on the Counties 7 CD's totaling \$684,886.33 being held at Peoples Bank. She mentioned that we have one final CD set to mature on September 18th, 2026, and will then be moved to Peoples Bank as well.

Karen also mentioned that we are still waiting on the SEMA funds coming in to be divided between the Road Departments in the amount close to \$321,000.00

Karen Sikes handed the Commissioners the June settlement statement to sign off on showing the list of all funds and where we stand currently.

Mark Pfeiffer mentioned that Road District 1 had applied for a matching grant through the insurance company and had been awarded \$9,775.00 to go toward a 14,000 lb. 4-post lift with 2 7,500 lb. rolling jacks to assist with maintenance on County vehicles.

Jared Boast mentioned that a landowner wanted the payment, in lieu of money, to be gravel for a temporary right of way on High Point Road. He stated that the commitment has been fulfilled. Jared also had updates on Sappington Bridge firework damage and what the next steps are to be done by the contractor as far as power washing, sanding and sealing the area.
